



Homer Burton Grommon and Agnes Clow Patterson

The Grommons arrived in the area from New York in the 1860's. Homer Burton Grommon married Agnes Clow Patterson in 1892. They lived on their farm on Book Rd and 104th street. H.B. was President of the Farmers National Grain Dealers Assoc. and the Illinois Grain Dealers Assoc. For many years he was active statewide and nationally in discussions of economic and political matters which effected the farmer. His son Frank continued farming and later George Grommon took over the family land and farmed until it was sold to make way for the Ashbury subdivision. George was a very successful farmer, innovative and hardworking. This was recognized by many Will County landowners who asked him to work their land. George, now 91, remembers growing up in the Wheatland area, attending the one room White school, enjoying family, friends, nature and the land. He feels a special need to honor and preserve the Wheatland Cemetery since so many of his forefathers, family and friends are buried there.
