
As mentioned last quarter, our building is 10 years old and has begun to settle and show its age. The landscaping changes will address some of our issues with water seepage through the original front doors; however, to protect the integrity of the building, we are having structural engineers assess how best to address the water and other issues. One unique situation that occurred this summer involved the township attic becoming a make-shift aviary. The local animal control folks believe that the cool, spring temperatures and early summer storms forced our bird population to seek more "controlled" accommodations. A design flaw allowed the birds easy access. And, of course, the feathered friends that chose our building are all protected species. Presently, we are not boarding birds so the engineers have been tasked with how best to plug the holes in our attic. One crucial improvement made, includes the new dual-action toilets. So be advised that they make a surprisingly ferocious sound, when flushed, and this is not a Halloween sound effect.

There are no elections this fall which means we all get a break from nasty commercials, annoying Robo Calls and/or candidates ringing your doorbells. Please be aware that Wheatland Township will no longer serve as an Early Voting site. High voter turnout secondary to more contentious elections have exceeded our limited space. Will County praised our handling of the overcrowded conditions, but agreed that the need has far outgrown Wheatland's accommodations. The county is exploring other nearby options and we will keep you posted. Please know that you can still register to vote at the township, Monday through Friday from 8:00am to 4:00pm. You will need two forms of ID and your current address must be listed on one.




Cemetery Committee

104th Street (west of Plainfield-Naperville Rd)







In the Spring, our Trustees conducted a survey of grave and burial costs at local cemeteries and voted to revise our pricing structure effective January 1st, 2020. The changes will be posted to our website by mid-December.



Prices are valid through DEC. 31st, 2019.
Payment in Full, via Cash or Check Only before interment.



Township Ordinance

Our cemetery 'rules' (Township Ordinance) can be viewed on the Cemetery's web site (4th item in the list above). All/Any Glass containers and decorations are prohibited and will be removed. Potted plants are permitted only when hung on a shepherd's hook (one hook per monument) and a vase should have a weep-hole so that stagnant water does not allow mosquito growth. Twice a year we conduct a clean-up of decorations in preparation for the next season. In the week of October 13th all Summer and worn decorations will be removed from grave sites.

Lastly, our 'Reclamation Project' concludes March 1st, 2020. We continue to search for the heirs of 'abandoned graves' to come forward



and present their claim as a direct descendant of a person listed in the Notice posted on the bulletin board near the flagpole in the cemetery and on our web site.

OH!...and when visiting the cemetery, please Do Not Drive nor Park in any area of the grave sites.

Please keep the car either on the road surface or parked in the grassy area NORTH of the tree in center of middle section (between entrance Gates and center Tree.

A Message from Highway Commissioner Bill Alstrom

The Road District takes pride in our snow and ice control. The Road District is responsible for 44.5 center lane-miles of streets. In addition to this, we plow 57 cul-de-sacs. Please be aware that careful planning and preparation go into each snow plowing event — No two storms are alike. Also, please use caution and be mindful when plows are out. Heavy slush discharge from the plow can knock down a mailbox. The Road District is not responsible for damage to a neglected mailbox. If your mailbox is damaged as a result of snow plowing, please contact the Road District.

- The Road District provides free Christmas tree pick-up for the unincorporated residents. The 2020 Christmas tree pick up is scheduled for Tuesday, January 07, 2020.
- The Wheatland Township Road District office has joined the Everbridge Mass Notification System. The Everbridge System provides residents with "Emergency

• The 2020 Brush Pick-Up dates are as follows*:

April 6 – 10, 2020 June 8 – June 12, 2020 October 5 – 9, 2020

May 11 – 15, 2020 September 14 – 18, 2020

Please remember that these are our target dates. If a holiday falls on any of these Mondays, pick up will begin the following day. Also, should there be a delay due to weather, equipment failure, etc. the date may vary. A detailed description of how bundles should be placed by the roadside can be found on our website. Brush should be placed at curbside by 7:00am.

- Wood chips are available to our residents free of charge. These are RAW chips, freshly chewed. A typical "load" holds approximately 6-8 yards or the size of a minivan. If interested in receiving a load, please call our office at 630-717-0092 ext #2 for details.
- Recently an Intergovernmental Agreement between Wheatland Township and Plainfield Township was signed for the joint purchase of a Vactor Truck. This truck is used to jet out the culverts and drainage lines that provides steady water flow. We will also be able to clean out the storm water inlets thru-out our subdivisions.

REMINDER:

TEXTING AND DRIVING LAW CHANGE: On July 1st, Illinois became a hands-free state. Law Enforcement Officers can now ticket drivers for texting, calling, navigating – anything that involves holding a cellphone, tablet or laptop. Violators face fines of \$75 for a first offense, \$100 for a second, \$125 for a third and \$150 for any more offenses. Three violations in a year and a driver's license could get revoked.
